Big changes in mission and ministry in Ladybarn, Withington and Didsbury

You may have heard about a "team ministry" bringing together Emmanuel and St James, Didsbury, St Paul's Withington, St Nick's and St Chad's. After years of disussion and planning each PCC is to be consulted about the changes. Assuming they all agree, the team ministry will become a reality, hopefully some time in the next few months.

The parishes will continue with their own churchwardens and PCCs but will not have their own rector in the way they have in the past. The five churches will be served by

three full-time priests plus, from time to time, one or more curates (apprentice priests). Changes to service patterns are inevitable.

We have already seen a trial run of this at St Chad's with Cate Allison here last Sunday and Josh Gaskell next Sunday. This will be the pattern for the next few months but further changes are likely after that.

This is happening all over Britain due to falling church attendances and severe financial problems in every denomination.
