From the Food Bank	<p>Newly released figures from the Trussell Trust include worrying new figures which reveal that, between April 2023 and March 2024, across our community 5786 emergency food parcels were provided to local people who couldn't afford the essentials – 2043 of these went to children. This is a 48% increase on last year. Urgent needs at the moment are cereals, UHT milk and fruit juice, pasta and curry sauces, baked beans, tinned soup, tinned fruit, sugar and coffee, nappies and baby wipes.</p>
